Meet Our Member Will "Cozz" Cozzens

- ▶ Dave: You're a long time member of the Senior Anglers. Have you always lived in North County?
- Cozz: I was born and spent the first 7 years of my life on a ranch in Western Wyoming. After my dad died, we moved into a nearby town.
- ► Dave: What was life like for you?
- Cozz: I grew up on a horse. We worked with sheep, cattle, and horses. We worked hard but loved the outdoors. Fishing and hunting were two of my favorite activities.
- ▶ Dave: How did you get to California?
- ► Cozz: We move to Highland where my grandfather lived in '49. He was a strong support for my mom.
- ► Dave: What kind of work did you do?
- ➤ Cozz: I joined the military service (Air Force) in 1951; became a Gunner and later a Flight Engineer. Flew missions from Okinawa to Korea. I enjoy telling today's Fighter pilots that I have over 800 hours of combat flying time. (The life expectancy of a modern fighter pilot in combat is measured in minutes). After the war ended, I was transferred to Norton AFB where I flew on various aircraft until 1959 when I started working with missiles. From there I spent a three year tour in Germany, went to Cheyenne in '62 and to Vandenberg in '66. Retired in '71 as NCOIC of Maintenance for the Minute Man program.
- Dave: What brought you to Escondido?
- Cozz: While at Norton, a fellow flier bought into the Redlands Airport. There I met his sister, Beverly. We have been married since 1955. After getting out of the military, we looked for a beautiful location, sunny, smog free And here we are. We live on a ½ acre of land which has 30 fruit trees of various types, two ponds (one of which houses koi fish), and a large garden.
- ▶ Dave: Besides maintaining your acreage, what other things occupy your time?
- Cozz: I work with semi-precious and precious stones and facet them for rings. I operated a manufacturing jewelry business out of our home for 27 years. I enjoy shooting and go out to the Escondido Gun Club on a regular basis. I am active in CERT (Community Emergency Response team) and fish whenever I can. We also have our triplet grandsons on weekends. They are our pride and joy.
- ▶ Dave: You've also been pretty active as a member of the Senior Anglers.
- Cozz: I've been V.P. of Salt Water, Historian, and now Parliamentarian. I've also organized the Trout Derbies and been active in cooking turkeys for our Turkey Fry.
- ▶ Dave: It has been a pleasure getting to know you better.

APRIL MEETING FEATURES NATIONALLY KNOWN AUTHOR



After a couple of programs featuring fresh water speakers, we turn to spotlight salt water fishing with a presentation by Jeff Spira, well known author and business executive. Jeff has been a saltwater fisherman his entire life and has been fishing in Southern California since the late 1960's and he is passionate about ocean fishing. His many books and articles cover a wide range of ocean related topics from fishing to boatbuilding.

Jeff's book, Saltwater Angler's Guide to Southern California, completed the third printing this month and is packed with over 400 pages of valuable information for all fishermen. The book provides detailed fishing information for the entire Southern California coastline from Santa Barbara to the Mexican border. He includes thorough descriptions of the best fishing spots along with many charts and maps, major species in the area, and even the best boat launches.

His book, Wrecks and Reefs, is the most complete listing of Southern California shipwrecks and artificial reefs, with complete GPS coordinates. It includes histories of these ships, how they sank, and even fishing and diving information. It is the most complete guide of Southern California submerged objects available today.

His website, www.socaloceanfishing.com is a fantastic resource. He highlights Southern California ocean fishing hot spots, ocean species, free videos and e-books, and extensive list of landings with information and web sites. In addition, he has links to free videos, e-books, and photo essays on boat construction.

The Senior Anglers of Escondido met the third Friday of each month at the Joslyn Center, 210 Park Avenue, in Escondido and everyone is welcome. The programs start at 9:30 AM and feature programs of interest to both salt and fresh water anglers.






Class II – Same as Class I except trip is not Club Sponsored.

**Species - designate type of bass, trout catfish, salmon, tuna, etc.

For purposes of Club Records and Awards, following shall be recognized:

- Largest fish caught during year for Class I– Fresh Water
- Largest fish caught during the year for Class I Salt Water
- Largest fish caught during the year for Class II Fresh Water
- Largest fish caught during the year for Class II Salt Water

Club Species Record: Club Historian shall record all Species Certificates. Species Records will be posted on the Web Site.

Members breaking old records need to submit proper evidence. They shall be recognized on a regular basis.
