Lake Cuyamaca has seen some nice fish this last month. One of my fishing buddies caught a 5 pounder and three other nice ones at Warren Estes' favorite secret spot (location involves a tree).

All the local lakes are teeming with fish. Be sure to get out soon before this great season starts winding down.

First place receives 50% of the pot, 2nd place is 30% and third place wins 20%. This is the day after a scheduled double trout stocking (3000 lbs.). Saturday March 23, 2013

We just held our Sixth Annual Youth Day at Lake Dixon . To say it was successful would be an understatement. Twenty six signed up and twenty six were at the lake. This isn't entirely the truth as twenty seven signed up but our Chairman of the event, **Roy Roque**, had a triple bypass surgery and spent 11 days in the hospital and just returned home on the evening of the 22^{nd} . Some details, the bus from the YMCA arrived two minutes early with 25 students from four different elementary schools in Escondido . The Counselors had the groups separated into fishermen and hikers. **Jim Stevenson** had six boats ready, also the boat Captains who took the kids to the dock, got in the boats and they shoved off at 8:00AM sharp to find some fish. In addition we had two lifeguards in a boat and were in visual contact with the other boats. The YMCA Coordinator, **Arlene Martinez**, who has been involved in previous year's Youth Day at the Lake, had the children and the counselors organized and she used walkie-talkie phones to communicate with the counselors that were away from the picnic areas.

Meanwhile the other students were introduced to our own **Simone Green**, Naturalist, who led them on a nature hike. Simone was kind enough to give each hiker a lanyard with a coyote tooth. What a neat idea and a treasure for each and every student. Each child also received a two inch button pin that had the name of this event and our clubs name. At 10:00 am the groups switched, the young anglers hiked and the hikers fished.



At noon both groups had returned and our Sr. Anglers had cooked, set up the picnic tables, iced up some sliced oranges and began serving hot dogs, hamburgers with all the trimmings, chips, juice and cookies. **Al Green** arranged the food preparations and his helpers did a great job getting everything ready for the hungry students. Not only did they feed the students, they fed the Counselors, the Park Rangers and of course the Senior Anglers that were working the event. I think it was about 65 people.
