APRIL FISHING CHALLENGE

If you missed out, you are going to have another chance. We are going to have the next challenge on April 15 at Lake Wolford. This will be a Senior Fishing Day, so boats will be discounted for seniors. The lake will be planting on April 14. This will be the last trout plant of the season.

The largest fish of the March challenge were caught along the Senior Shoreline. Fishing conditions are good since the lake staff has cleared away most of the reeds and brush from the Senior Shoreline. The baits of choice in March were mouse tails and power baits.

If you plan on attending, remember that you have to have a current California fishing license. You will also need to bring a credit card since the lake is not accepting cash. You will also have to wear a mask when purchasing a lake permit and any time you are on the boat dock.

No fish were caught that day, but that really wasn't the purpose. A memorial remembrance of Don Continelli was held. Ken Harrison officiated and gave a short eulogy.





Yellow Daisies

In Ken's words . . .

"Don was 74, a beloved, husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend, died on February 10, unexpectedly from a heart attack, in his home in Escondido. Don was born in 1946 in Vallejo, California. He was raised in San Diego County and graduated from Grossmont High School in 1964. He served in the USMC for three years, including a tour of duty in Vietnam.

Don married Norma Terry in 1967 and they had two beautiful daughters, Laura and Christina. He retired from the San Diego County Sheriff's Department in 2002 after a long 31-year career. He then joined the State of California Department of Consumer Affairs as an investigator.

He was also incredibly active and energetic being an avid bicyclist, gardener, fisherman, and general outdoorsman. He was a force of nature, one of those people who could never sit still, and had a great deal of curiosity about the world. His was a life based on service and an abiding sense of duty: to country, community, and family.

That was from his obituary. But it is not those things that brought us here today. In this gathering friends, the love and the friendship we feel for Don, there is sadness that a loved one, is now gone. But it is not the physical body that brought us here in memory, it was his god given qualities, a love of fishing, camping, and being in the club.

Each of us is dealing with the loss of this wonderful friend each in our own way. We are all mature enough in life to know that we could not have changed the outcome, so we are here today, to celebrate a life that was rich and full, and will continue to be rich and full by the circle of friends gathered here today. Let us look upon this passing as an opportunity to affirm life.

We can ask ourselves why? Why? Why? If only he ... But I believe we are spiritual beings living in a limited human form. We are to never know the answers to these questions. Why a man so young and full of life is now gone?

We pay tribute to him by coming out here and fishing. By supporting each other with laughter, fish stories, and catching fish, being open to trying new baits, and different spots. He would have loved that we were here, freezing in the cold water, to just fish.

I believe our mission in life is to leave the world a better place than when we arrived. Is our life better because we knew Don? Mission accomplished! The on-going tribute to him is to let our life be better because of his presence in it."

After the eulogy the group, silently, tossed yellow daisies into the surf.
