PROGRAMS



Corrina Dugger, of the Sacramento office of the State Parks Department, Division of Boating & Waterways, will be the guest speaker and explain a new program requiring all boat operators to have a California Boater Identification Card. It requires boat operators take a boater safety course, either on line or at an in-person class.

Currently, only those boat operators, age 12-18, need an ID card. But the age requirement goes up each year until all ages are required by 2025. The cost of the card is \$10.00. Classes held throughout the state, by independent firms, is an additional cost. Kind of like traffic school for boaters.

The volunteer shared a 2015 state report, which stated, "724 California recreational vessels were involved in reported accidents and 49 boaters died. Only one operator in the fatal accidents had taken prior training."

SURF FISHING

From the Fishing Pier at Oceanside Harbor . . .

The July Surf Fishing Tournament was a special one, designed as a celebration for club members and Tournament participants halfway through the tournament season. Since the Tournament has generated more than enough entry fees to cover the cost of year-end prizes, the club's Board approved a request to provide a nice, free lunch.

The event was held at the Oceanside Harbor Pier. The non-tournament event was designed to welcome those for that may not be able to get aboard a boat, or climb over lakefront rocks. It was a just "sit and fish" day, easily accessible to those with limited mobility. The weather and water conditions were perfect.

After a few hours of fishing, the club hosted a Hot Dog BBQ, with baked beans, macaroni salad, olives, pickles, veggies and dip, chips, cookies, and special punch.

Since this was a non-tournament event, but still a Class 1 outing, **Ken** will receive the pin that Frank already had a spot picked out on his cap.

Our next Surf Fishing competition is set for August 13⁻ We'll meet for an early dinner at 4:15 p.m. at Capt. Keno's Restaurant, 158 N. Coast Highway 101 in Encinitas (just north of Encinitas Blvd.), then head south just a few miles to San Elijo State Beach campground on Coast Highway 101 in Cardiff by the Sea.
