FROM THE EASTERN SIERRA

The weather continues to be warm, 100 plus most days in Bishop, and 80s to 90s in the High Sierra. This causes anglers to go deep. Fish are floating in their perfect cool water temperature, around 45 degrees below. Expand 2 lb. bait leaders to 6 feet long to get up off the weeds.

An early bird will get your worm, if you're on the water at the official time of one hour before sunrise. Everything shuts down around 8:00 am when the sun hits the water. Fish are going into the deep cool water. They won't return until around 5:00 pm, with the best time between 7:00-8:00 pm.

Power Bait, pinch worms, mouse-tails, and night crawlers continue to do well. Check the local tackle shops for the active baits and colors. Believe it or not, they do change weekly. Who knows why? Trollers are using six to seven colors on their line, sometimes up to nine, to get down low in the water.

Check out a complete list of CDFW stocking schedules for California's inland waters on the CDFW website under "fish plants." Search by county, individual waters, or type of fish.

Meanwhile, local resorts, landings, and tourism agencies are continuing to buy and stock the Oregon Trophy Trout, usually 3 - 5 pounds but some up to 9 pounds.

Did you know it's against the law for lake operators to buy trout from a California hatchery? Oh boy . . . don't get me started about California fishing regulations.

CDFW is cautioning of not trying to catch fish during the warmer daytime hours. Should one even bite, they say the fish will be very stressed by the time landed, and it will not revive if catching and releasing. They suggest bring it in, without fighting it, until you can see it, then cut the line, to increase resource survivability rate.

There's a Bass Tournament series ongoing on August 8 and October 2 in Bishop-area lakes. Bass? In the Eastern Sierra? Check the Mono County Tourism website for area trout derby's and tournaments.
