TROUT CHALLENGE

January 24 was the club's 2nd Trout Challenge for the 2018/19 season. Seven club members fished the windy Lake Wohlford, from shore and boat, with ten trout caught.

The \$35 Jackpot winner was **Ron Bloom**, with a nice 2.56 pounder. It looked like a Nebraska Tailwalker with its hooked jaw and a gold strip down its side. But the City of Escondido doesn't plant Tailwalkers anymore, unless the hatchery put some in on its own.

John Testor caught four nice trout. **Hank Mabrey** caught two, and went out after the weigh-in, in the afternoon, along with **Smick Smeskal**, and they picked up three more. **Jim Davidson** caught one.

The next Trout Challenge, our third of five for the season, will be again at Lake Wohlford on Thursday, February 21, with 3,000# planted over the previous six days.

2018 SURF FISHING TOURNAMENT

SAE's 2019 Surf Fishing Tournament will commence on March 18, 2019 during the Club's San Onofre Campout. It will end on or about October 3, 2019 during a "Surf Fishing Safari" campout at a state or county campground in Santa Barbara County.

Anglers will be competing for cash prizes for the largest fish caught during each monthly challenge and the largest fish caught during the entire tournament.

Tournament dates will continue to be on the first Monday following a regular Club meeting (the second Friday of each month). A schedule of the tournament dates, times and locations is being prepared and will available on-line and during the Club's regular March meeting.

Exception: if a tournament Monday falls on a holiday the challenge will held the following day (Tuesday). Tournament start times and locations are subject to change depending on the weather, tides and surf conditions. Generally, a tournament challenge will begin 1 to 2 hours before high tide and end 2 hours after high tide. The tournament locations and start times will be announced in the monthly SAE newsletter and our Facebook site.

The 2019 tournament will be open to SAE members and their guests.

This year's tournament will be similar to the Club's monthly trout challenges:

A \$5.00 entry fee will be collected from each competitor prior to start of each challenge. A roster of competitors and fish reports will be submitted to the Saltwater V.P. following each tournament challenge. Competitors may use their own scales to weigh their fish **however**, individual scales must be certified by the Tournament Director or his designee at or before the start of each challenge. The Angler with the largest fish caught that day will win ½ of the entry fees collected that day. The remaining fees will rollover into an end-of-tournament prize fund for the 1st through 3rd overall finishers.

Eligible Species

All species of ocean fish that are of legal size and eligible for taking, pursuant to the California Fish and Game Regulations, will be considered an eligible species.

Verification of an Eligible Species

Verification of an eligible species shall be certified in the following manner:

Submission of a SAE "Large Fish Documentation" (revision 3/2018), (1) identifying the competitor, (2) the species, (3) the weight, using a scale certified by a tournament official (4) a witness' name (the witness need not be a SAE member) and (5) if possible, a photograph of the fish.

Locations

All eligible species must have been caught from an ocean facing beach (shoreline). Any species taken from a bay, causeway, harbor, lagoon or similar body of water or structure will be considered an in-eligible catch.

Dispute Resolution

Any dispute involving the interpretation of the tournament rules or any dispute surrounding a tournament rule, arising before, during or after the 2019 SAE Surf Fishing Tournament shall be resolved by the SAE President and Vice Presidents of Salt and Fresh Water Fishing.

SALTWATER

We're starting off the year right for saltwater. The Bluefin and Yellowfin are close from the North and South! The squid are abundant and brings the fish in at Catalina.



FEBRUARY BAKE SALE





This is always a fun event. If you're not a baker, this is a great chance to take home some homemade goodies. As you probably know, we have some expert bakers in our club, so expect some real treats.

Speaking of good things to eat, at the Fall Feast Karen Kirchnavy won the first prize in our Pumpkin Dessert Contest with this great recipe. She had so many requests for the recipe that we decided to print it here for out members.

Snappy Pumpkin Cheesecake (from the "Taste of Home" cookbook)

Crust:

1 1/2c. crushed gingersnap cookies

1/2c. finely chopped pecans

1/4c. melted butter

Filling:

2-8oz. pkgs. softened cream cheese

3/4c. sugar divided

1 tsp. vanilla

3 eggs, lightly beaten

1c. canned pumpkin

2 tsp. Pumpkin Pie spice or 1 tsp. cinnamon plus 3/4tsp nutmeg

Garnish (optional): Whipped topping and additional gingersnap cookies cut into wedges

Place a greased 9" springform pan on a double thickness of alum. foil & securely wrap around pan. Set aside.

In a small bowl combine cookie crumbs& pecans, stir in melted butter then press into prepared pan . Bake at 325* 9-11 min. or until set. Set aside on wire rack to cool.

In a large mixing bowl beat cream cheese with 1/2 c. sugar until smooth, add vanilla then eggs, beat on low just until combined.

Place 1 c. filling in a small bowl, stir in the pumpkin, spices & remaining 1/4 c. sugar. Remove 3/4 c. filling, set aside. Pour remaining pumpkin filling into the crust, top with plain filling. Drop reserved pumpkin filling by spoonful's over top, cut through filling with a knife to swirl.

Place pan in a large baking pan, add 1 inch of hot water to baking pan to make a water bath. Bake for 50-60 min. or until center is just set and top appears dull. Remove springform pan from the water bath. Cool on a wire rack for 10 min. then carefully run a
