As you probably know, bottom fishing is closed in California during January and February. I have included below the current schedule for the Oceanside Senior Anglers for your information. They welcome our members on all their trips.

The Rancho Bernardo Anglers Club is another resource for saltwater trips. They will have an Ensenada bottom fishing trip on February 9. This is a one-day trip on the Gamefisher out of Ensenada. Only eight anglers are the limit on these trips. Anglers meet at Brown Field in Otay Mesa at about 5-6 AM returning at about 8 PM. Van transportation to Ensenada and back is provided. Passports and Mexican licenses are required. Contact Frank Moton at 858-220-0388 to make arrangements if you are interested. Several SAE members have gone on these trips previously. They are a lot of fun and you usually bring home a lot of fish. Rancho Bernardo hasn't finalized their schedule yet beyond February.


# A FISH STORY

California Academy of Sciences Senior Biologist Allan Jan checks in on Methuselah the Australian Lungfish in its enclosure at the Steinhart Aquarium in San Francisco. Believed to be more than 90 years old, Methuselah is the oldest living fish in a zoological setting.

When Methuselah the lungfish arrived at the Steinhart Aquarium in 1938, Al Capone was locked up in Alcatraz, the Golden Gate Bridge had been open less than a year and Willie Mays was 6 years old.
