John's goal is to educate, let people know that fraud is very common, and to remind people that reporting and telling their story will help prevent others from becoming victims. Many examples of what to look for and what to do if you have been scammed or defrauded will be presented and discussed.

#### LAKE DIXON FISHING DERBY


