DECEMBER ON-SHORE TOURNAMENT

This month's On-shore Tournament was held on the morning of December 17th at Buccaneer Beach in Oceanside.

Marge Lovelady, Cheryl Brandstrom, Daria Gardynik, Jerry Watanabe, Jim Davidson and I enjoyed a cool (but not uncomfortable) morning with mild, weedless surf conditions and an extremely high tide.

We landed sixteen small barred perch using live mussels or worms. Marge, Jim and I each caught the largest fish, 3 oz perch and shared the \$30.00 pot.





Jerry and I pitched various swim baits in the hopes of landing a halibut but no such luck. **Jerry** did have a large corbina strike but it threw the hook when it jumped out of the water.

Yes, our fish were small, but you must remember we're fishing with light line and tackle and the fish that feed in the shallow surf hit hard and are unbelievable fighters.

JANIUARY ON-SHORE TOURNAMENT

Our 2021 On-shore Fishing Tournament Season will begin January 19th on the Oceanside Fishing Pier (weather permitting). This is the Ocean, not the Harbor Pier, for you flatlanders. We will sign-up on the pier at 8:30 am and finish about 2:00 pm. The entry fee is \$5.00. If we have more than 10 anglers the pot will be split with half going to the person with the largest fish and half to the person with the most fish landed.

If you recall, this is where and about when, **Tom Galyean** landed his 1 lb. 2 oz. barred perch last year. He was using a live blood or lug worm dropped into the breaking surf.

First timers, there is a small kiosk that sells frozen bait and snacks along with a restaurant, but these may not be open.


