Senior Anglers host presentation on the "Secrets of Dixon Lake"

With trophy size catches of both trout and bass in recent months, it's time to hear what has produced these recent record fish hook-ups and what has caused Dixon Lake to be a destination lake for Southern California anglers. Ready to reveal the "Secrets of Dixon," the Senior Anglers of Escondido have invited Tony Smock, Escondido Superintendent of Lakes and Open Spaces, to speak at their July 15 meeting at the Joslyn Center in Escondido.

Tony will highlight fishing at Dixon Lake and reveal good fishing locations, effective types of bait, and details on the stocking of quality fish which has produced a trophy size 13.4 pound trout plus several recent large bass catches. He also plans to discuss details of fishing at Dixon including hours, rentals, special programs, and plans for the future.



Dixon Lake is family-friendly and recently started night fishing on Thursday and Friday nights. Anglers need a daily fishing Lake Permit, however a California fishing License is not needed since the lake received a special Aquaculture Permit.

The Escondido Senior Anglers meets the third Friday of each month at the Joslyn Center, 210 Park Avenue in Escondido. The program starts at 9:30 AM and features programs of interest to local anglers of all ages.

Most mornings Simone led them on hikes either around the campground or up in the mountains.

SALTWATER

The bluefin tuna are biting and there are a few albacore starting to show up. There is even an occasional opah in the counts and the Sea Adventure 80 just got back from a 2 day with 98 yellowtail. There is a lot more fish being hooked than being landed because a lot of the people that are going out are unprepared for the fish being hooked. I am told you need to use at least 30 lb test line and a fast action rod with plenty of backbone so you can get the fish to gaff when it starts to circle (probably a 50-60lb rod). If you use a rod that is too light or too parabolic you will lose a lot of fish.

We have openings on the August 14-16 trip. Call Gordon Calvano if you are interested in that trip (760-729-3523). The fish that have been biting are all very good quality fish in the 30-60 lb class. Don't miss out on the chance to get on this year.

Don't forget surf fishing:

<u>Friday July 22, 2011 7:30 AM to 1:00 PM:</u> Oceanside Harbor Fishing Pier. If you have an aerator and a bucket bring it along and we'll try our luck at catching live bait or using anchovies from the bait dock. Otherwise plan on using squid or mackerel.

<u>Friday August 12, 2011, 1 PM to 6 PM:</u> Mission Bay Park/Playa Pacifica Parking Lot. Exit I5 @ Claremont Drive off ramp. Turn right towards the Bay and left of Mission Bay Dr. Go south a short distance to Playa Pacifica Parking Area. Plan on having a picnic. We'll dig razor clams for bait and blood worms would work well, too.

Tuesday – August 30, 2011 6 AM to Noon: Ponto State Beach - between lifeguard towers 21 and 22. A portion of Batiquitos Lagoon should be accessible. Suggested baits red worms, mussels, sand crabs and Gulp shrimp. Directions: I-5 to Poinsettia turning west towards the beach then left (south) on Coast Highway, drop down to the flats where you'll see towers 21 and 22.

<u>Friday – September 23, 2011 12 PM to 6PM:</u> South Carlsbad State Park between lifeguard towers 28 and 29. Suggested bait bloodworms, sand crabs, mussels and Power Bait's Gulp Shrimp. Directions: Take Palomar Airport Road off I-5 to Coast Hwy. Go south on Coast Highway for about 1 1/2 miles look for tower 28 on the ocean side.





