SALTWATER

The fishing has been amazing on the long-range boats. Local boats have had several very lucky Bluefin catches along with yellowfin. It's still early but they are getting closer every day. With the weather and water temp getting warmer the fish are getting closer to the all day and 3/4 day range. However, the offshore fishing will always be more abundant.

Here are a few trips you can get on and be counted as a Class 1 trip:

- August 6-8 and Sept 3-5 both trips are 1.5 days aboard the Voyager and limited to 13 anglers.
 The cost is \$433 with meals included.
- Oct 7-11 a 3.5 day trip aboard the Poseidon and limited to 20 anglers. The cost is \$673. There are only a few spots left on these trips so call **Jim Mauritz** at 760-450-7060 ASAP.
- August 18, 19, 20 and September 15-17 are 1.5 day tuna trips on the Voyager out of Seaforth. The cost is \$400
- October 7-9 1.5 day tuna on the Relentless out of H&M landing. The cost is \$375.

SURF FISHING REPORT

From the shores of South Ponto State Beach . . .

An absolutely perfect SoCal day greeted surf anglers on June 20 after an incredible breakfast at Tip Top Meats. Plenty of sand near Lifeguard Tower 21, and almost no waves or seaweed, meant long casts right into the hot spots. A strong northern surge is the only thing that kept us from busting it wide open.

Participants included_Gary Farrar, Ron Bloom, Paul Wilton, Frank & Pat Mancha, Ken Harrison, and Don Continelli. Two guests, and hopefully future members, joined us: Richard Reed and Mike Palley.

The jackpot was won by **Don Continelli**, using a live bloodworm – a 1 lb. 1 oz. Corbina. Overall, members caught six fish. **Frank Mancha** landed a 2 oz. Croaker. **Paul Wilton**, a 4 oz. Croaker, and **Don** caught four total – a Barred Perch, another Corbina, and a Crocker.

Our guests caught five fish. All 11 fish were caught with live and plastic worms, or plastic sand crabs, and were released.




