A Line from your President....

FROM THE EASTERN SIERRA

Good news on CDFW stocking of the Eastern Sierra lakes. Announced a few weeks ago; the Hot Creek Hatchery was quarantined with the finding of the dreaded Lactococcus Garvieae virus. After a testing from all runways, only one fish was found to have the virus. And it was a bacterial strain that could, if needed, be treated prior to stocking. Stocking by CDFW has resumed on a limited capacity.

Check out a complete list of CDFW stocking schedules for California's inland waters on the CDFW website under "fish plants." Search by county, individual waters, or type of fish.

Meanwhile, local resorts, landings, and tourism agencies are continuing to buy and stock the Oregon Trophy trout – usually 3 - 5 lb. but some up to 9 lb.. So the theme this year is one or two big fish to post on Facebook, thus creating a buzz for the eastside in the angler community. Limits are few and far between. I have yet to see or hear of anyone catching a five-fish limit.

The ticket for July, with now warmer water, is early morning or late evening, when the sun is off the water. Ernie's suggests a four-foot, 2 lb. leader – six foot if using a dry fly/bubble. The usual baits/lures/flies are all working. Believe it or not, according to our radio station's weekly fishing reports from **Ernie's in June Lake**, **Rick's Sport Center in Mammoth, and Convict Lake**, the trout's color preferences of Berkley Power Bait and Mice Tails do seem to change week-by-week. Strange? But true! Check in with any local tackle shop for the latest in colors.

Campers arriving without site reservations are being disappointed, finding most campgrounds full with many first come - first serve sites are now under the reservation system, snuck through by the Forest Service and their concessionaires during last summer's COVID-reduced attendance.

Several fishing tournaments are going on this summer from Convict Lake up to Walker Creek, with cash and prizes. Check out the Mono County's Tourism website. You can also subscribe for a nice and colorful "things-to-do" email update as well.

There's a Bass Tournament series ongoing on August 8 and October 2 in Bishop-area lakes. Bass? In the Eastern Sierra? Well attended it seems, even by some famous pros. I guess not everyone goes after our beloved trout.




