SALT WATER

Fishing is going to be different up in Oceanside. We all agreed to give it a try. Fishing has been good even with the low water temp and brisk SE winds which is really typical of May fishing. By June the red tide will be gone and the fishing even better. The Chubasco is catching nice Halibut, Bass, rock fish and even white sea bass. This is a different area to fish and I believe a white sea bass is a prized wonderful tasting fish. There's plenty of bait in the water and when the wind stops blowing the fishing will explode!!

SALT WATER (CONT.)

Remember if you catch a legal white sea bass to take the head to one of the Hubbs drop off places so they can track and monitor the fishes diet, growth, movement and survival rate from the Carlsbad Hatchery. Helgrens is an official drop off site.

From the shore at Carlsbad State Beach . . .

The May 14th Surf Fishing Tournament was held at Carlsbad's North Ponto beach. Club competitors enjoyed another great meal at Tip Top Meats, before heading out for an afternoon of fun fishing. The weather and surf conditions were great.

Barred Surf Perch by **Don Continelli**, now the tournament leader. **Ken Harrison** had caught the tournament record, a 10 oz. Corbina, only to be topped by Don 10 minutes later.

The other fish were either Perch or Corbina. This is a good sign the remainder of the tournament could produce some larger fish.
