

Gary K Vanderlyke AKA The Cowboy

How does a guy born and raised in New York end up with a name like the "Cowboy"? You grow up in Western New York, of course. Growing up in Rochester New York, I learned to love fishing alongside my father, brother and uncles where we spent much time fishing the Finger Lakes region, as well as Lake Ontario, the Thousand Islands and Canada.

In 1956 upon leaving high school I joined the U.S. Navy where I sailed the seas after completing Boot Camp as a Communication Technician. While in the Navy I spent time in Hawaii, Guam, the Philippines and Japan serving on the Ranger and the Midway. Upon completing my service in the Navy, I returned to Rochester New York, married my wife of 54 years **Barbara** and began what would be a 55-year career in the car business. The harsh winters and muggy summers brought thoughts of beautiful San Diego. So, in 1972 I, with my wife and two children **Leila** and **Gary Jr**. began our life in beautiful Escondido, where we reside to this day.

In the late 70's I landed my first albacore on the Oceanside 95 in the company of the late Dick Helgren. Soon after, I began TRU (Tuna Roundup Charter), whose logo included a Cowboy riding a tuna. The charter was sometimes referred to as the Easter Bunny charter in honor of a two day Easter Trip, which became an anticipated annual event. From two-day charter to 12 day charters aboard the American Angler and Vagabond, along with long time friend John Kline of the Qualifier 105, we made countless trips. We caught tons of fish. Some of the most memorable include a 250 lb. Yellow Fin Tuna, a 140 lb. Big Eye and many Wahoo, Dorado and Blue Fin Tuna.

Pete Gray decided to launch his own radio show alongside Marty Milner. As a part of a contest to name the show, I suggested the show begin with the sound of the reel clicking followed by someone saying Let's Talk Hook Up! Twenty-six years later this still can be heard at the start of the finest fishing show in the country. I have been given the opportunity to remain connected to the show to this day as the "Prize Cowboy". This allows me to connect with both experienced and new fishing enthusiasts.

In 2008 I become involved with the Escondido Senior Anglers under the leadership of then President **Ron Parker.** I very much enjoy being a member, sharing my cookies with all who attend our meetings.

I'd like to end by asking that all who value fishing, especially the youth, involve themselves with the Costal Conservation Association of California (www.ccacalifornia.org). This organization supports maintaining the rights of sports fisherman. My final words of wisdom to you all are simply this; **stop wishing**, **go fishing**.
