

#### LOCAL FISHING

Again I have to say I can't believe the SW fishing. The Eclipse caught 93 yellowtail on a 1 1/2 day trip IN FEBRUARY!!

March 1st the Rockfish Season opens. So go get those tasty tacos.

If you have a lobster card the California Code of Regulations requires you to report the data on the card to CDFW by April 30, 2016 (whether you took a lobster or not). Look on the card for on line report or mail it in.

### **SALTWATER FUN FACTS**

I have some conservation information from Oceanside Senior Anglers I thought was guite interesting: Are you in the Correct Zone? The open ocean, or pelagic zone, consists of everything in the ocean outside of coastal areas. The demersal zone is everything in the ocean near the sea floor or the coast. The subzones are separated into epipelagic, mesopelagic, bathypelagic, abyssopelagic and hadopelagic. The epipelagic zone is closest to the surface and stretches down 600ft. An abundance of light allows for photosynthesis by plants and nutrients for fish like tuna. The mesopelagic zone, also known as the twilight zone, begins at 600ft down and reaches a depth of 3000ft and has a little light but not enough for photosynthesis to occur. The bathypelagic zone follows from 3000-13000ft in depth, a subzone containing the infrequent bioluminescent organisms. The abyssopelagic zone is located from 13,000m to directly above the ocean floor and is a completely dark area home to colorless and blind animals. The deepest subzone is the hadopelagic zone, a name that originates from the Greek underworld Hades and refers to the ocean water in submarine trenches.
