PROGRAMS

March Speaker: April Esconde



The CDFW manages and protects the state's wildlife,

wildflowers, trees, mushrooms, algae, and native habitats. The department is responsible for regulatory enforcement and management of related recreational, commercial, scientific, and educational uses. The department also prevents illegal poaching. CDFW wardens are armed law enforcement officers with statewide arrest authority. Their mission is to enforce California state laws related to hunting, fishing, pollution, endangered species, and wildlife habitat destruction. However, they can enforce any state law, anywhere in the state. Vehicles used range from patrol pickups to boats, catamarans, four-wheelers, snow-mobiles, horses, helicopters, and planes. The wardens investigate, collect evidence, serve search warrants, arrest criminals, and ensure public safety. Wardens patrol the state of California and 200 miles off the coast. April has a background in animal science and wildlife management and will discuss changes in state regulations regarding fishing and boater safety.
