DAVE GEHRKE INTERVIEWS DAVE GEHRKE

A little unusual, but I thought I would turn the tables around and be the interviewee this month and put myself in a different role.

- ▶ Dave: When and where did you begin your fishing interest?
- ▶ Dave: I grew up in northwest Indiana right next to Chicago. Our family spent every summer in a cottage on a beautiful natural lake in Michigan. As a kid I would spend 6 hours a day either on or in the water. There were plenty of perch, bluegill, crappie, bass and other pan fish. I sold worms and minnows to the dads who drove up each weekend. I fished with my dad, brother, and friends. The cane pole and bobber were my weapons.
- ► Dave: How did you get to California?
- ▶ Dave: Anitra and I met in high school, were married during our college (Purdue) years. After graduation I got a job teaching in the Los Angeles School District. We both earned our Masters Degree from U.C.L.A. Three children later we decided to find a school for our oldest and moved to the 1000 Oaks area where we both got teaching jobs.
- ▶ Dave: So how did you end up in Escondido?
- ▶ Dave: We then moved to Bakersfield where I became a school Principal. Anitra taught in the local high school and at the college level. We both continued our education with Anitra earning her Doctorate from U.C.L.A. and I getting mine at U.S.C. After our boys graduated from college they all moved to the San Diego area, married and started to have children. After we retired we also moved here to be near our kids and grandkids.
- ▶ Dave: How did you hear about the Senior Anglers?

Frank plans to cover several of their new projects and upgrades to the Dominator. Anglers will also hear about fishing techniques, new tackle and electronic gear, fishing locations, recent fish catches, and how to have a successful total sportfishing experience.

The Dominator is a 65' charter boat with state of the art technology to get to the fishing grounds

and back quickly and safely.

Their bridge is outfitted with the latest in fish finding and communications equipment. They have a spacious galley and comfortable accommodations for all guests.

They are now located at Point Loma Sportfishing in San Diego.

The Escondido Senior Anglers is open to the public and meets the third Friday of each month at the Joslyn Center, 210 Park Avenue in Escondido. The program starts at 9:30 AM and features programs of interest to both salt and fresh water.






- Largest fish caught during the year for Class I Salt Water

- Largest fish caught during the year for Class II Salt Water

Club Species Record: Club Historian shall record all Species Certificates. Species Records will be posted on the Web Site.

Members breaking old records need to submit proper evidence. They shall be recognized on a regular basis.
