Once again, I would like to thank **Ron and Carol Parke**r for the great job they did as acting president during the three months **Joann** and I were in Florida. As for Florida, I have been bass fishing for 52 years, and this year was without a doubt the best I've ever experienced.

In April, the SAE club had an outing at Lake Lopez. The lake levels have gone from 16% up to 61%, thanks to the rain we received for the first three months of this year. While freshwater fishing was slow, the food and camaraderie were outstanding. Six members took one day to go saltwater fishing. This trip turned out to be "a trip of a lifetime". One of the deckhands mentioned this trip was the best fishing trip that he had ever seen, with limits of Vermillion Rock fish from 4 to 7 pounds, Copper Rock fish from 4 to 6 pounds, and Lingcod weighing up to 10 pounds and 4 ounces. All the fisherman came home with huge bags of fillets.

The fishing challenge for April was won by **Albert Wilson** with a 2 lbs. 9 oz. trout from Lake Wohlford.

The Senior Anglers assisted in the annual Kiwanis Trout Derby. This was a two-day event with many fish weighing from 8 to 12 pounds.
