The heaviest fish ever caught on a rod and reel was a great white shark weighing a jaw-dropping 2,664 pounds!

The world's smallest fish, the Paedocypris, measures just 7.9 millimeters—tinier than a fingernail.

Parrotfish sleep in a protective cocoon of mucus to shield themselves from predators while resting.

- The oldest known fishing hook, carved from a snail shell, is over 23,000 years old.
- The Mekong giant catfish is a freshwater titan that can grow up to 10 feet long and weigh over 600 pounds.
- Anglerfish have their own built-in fishing rods—a glowing lure atop their heads to attract prey!

Fishing goes way back to the Paleolithic era, around 40,000 years ago.


