Pinezanita, Oct. 15-20

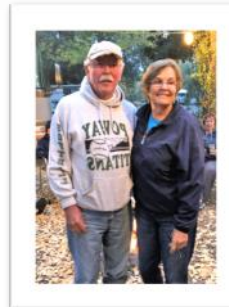

Our leader is **Don Continelli** with an 11oz. Barred Surfperch. **Cheryl Brandstrom** is second with her 9oz. Sculpin caught at San Onofre, followed by **Bill Modi's** 7 oz. Corbina and **Jim Stevenson's** 7oz Barred Surfperch.

The highlight of the tournament was **Cheryl's** Sculpin. This species is normally found in deeper water. Good job **Cheryl**.

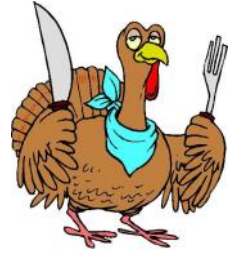
