November Speaker: Detective Mike Nelson Escondido Police Department

The incidence of scams targeting older adults is escalating. The most prevalent financial scams aimed at seniors include government impersonation, sweepstakes, and robocall scams. These financial crimes can have catastrophic effects on older adults, often leaving them without any means to recover their losses. Discover how to recognize and prevent the top 5 financial scams that target seniors. These scams are not only costly and widespread but are also increasing alarmingly. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) reported that in 2021, there were 92,371 older victims of fraud, resulting in losses of \$1.7 billion. This marked a 74% increase in losses compared to 2020.



The Anglers need to schedule a couple of people to set up the derby table at 6 am on Saturday and Sunday. This is under the shelter above the Senior Fishing Dock, next to the food vendors. Note: volunteers usually get fed! Breakfast burritos, hamburgers, brats, hot dogs, etc., are available. We need shifts of at least two people for the duration, one to read the scale and another to witness and record.


For the Kiddie Pond, 3 or 4 people are needed for the hours noted above. Usually, there are additional people from the Kiwanis and the local high school Key Clubs. The whole weekend is fun, but the Kiddie Pond is a blast; we help dangle a baited hook in the trout-filled kiddie pond, and then assist a 5-year-old in getting his/her first trout into a baggie. You will see the biggest smiles on the lake here. Refreshing.

If you can't seem to get out of the house for the weekend, consider helping us build the kiddie pond. Jim MacIssac has pre-assembled all the materials so that our combined crew can put it together and position it next to the water, ready for the trout arriving on Wednesday. No free lunch here, but we only need you for 2 hours in the afternoon.

There is one special challenge this year. Most volunteer sign-ups happen at club meetings. This year, the meeting is 2 weeks before the event. There will be sign-ups at the meeting on November 17 (a week later than usual due to Veterans Day), but to everyone who has said they "will help out whenever we are needed," please let me know when you can be at the lake!




