LAKE DIXON TROUT DERBY AND KIDDY POND

Volunteers Needed for Kiddie Pond construction, Derby scale, and Kiddie Pond

This year's event is the weekend before Thanksgiving. The kiddle pond construction will be on Monday, November 18th, at 3:00 pm, usually lasting two hours at most. It will be a lot of fun.



The Kiddie Pond (and Lake) stocking is scheduled for Wednesday the 20th. Many people come every year to watch. The stocking is generally about midday, depending on the highway traffic.

Kids get a chance to catch some nice trout on Saturday (morning 9-11 am and afternoon 1-3 pm) and then again on Sunday (9-11 am and 1-3 pm). Although Hidden Valley Kiwanis and the local high school Key Clubbers will help, we need a lot of help here. Generally, there are six people per shift.

The fishing derby is a big deal. There should be \$1500 in prizes for several categories (there is a category for seniors, incidentally). We need two volunteers at the scale station: one to weigh contending fish and the other to witness and record each entry. The derby starts at 6 am and runs until 5 pm. The actual hours may be edited because of lake fishing regulations and the end of daylight savings time.

The club needs everyone to pitch in. While six experienced members have signed up already, we could use 10 or 12 more.

Typically, volunteers receive vouchers for a boat and permits from the city and some breakfast and lunch from the Kiwanis. The next club meeting, November 8th, will be the last chance to sign up before the event.


